Spiritual Letter from Fr. Richard Jakubauskas



ELECTION DAY CAKE

Cookbook author Fannie Farmer recipe for Election Cake, from the Boston Cooking-School Cookbook, 1911, orig. 1896).

Ingredients

- 1/2 cup butter
- 1 cup bread dough
- 8 finely chopped figs
- 1 1/4 cups flour
- 1 egg
- 1/2 teaspoon soda
- 1 cup brown sugar
- 1/2 cup sour milk
- 2/3 cup raisins seeded, cut into pieces
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1/4 teaspoon each of clove, mace and nutmeg
- 1 teaspoon salt



Work butter into dough, using the hand. Add egg well beaten, sugar, milk, fruit dredged with two tablespoons flour, and flour mixed and sifted with remaining ingredients. Put into a well-buttered bread pan, cover, and let rise one and one-fourth hours. Then bake one hour in a slow oven. Cover with Boiled Milk Frosting.

CRANBERRY BREAD



Ingredients

- 1 cup sugar
- 2 tablespoons butter, softened
- 1 egg
- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 1/2 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 cup chopped fresh cranberries
- 3/4 cup orange juice
- 1/2 cup chopped walnuts

Instructions

Cream the sugar and butter until smooth. Beat in the egg. Add the flour, baking soda, baking powder, salt, cranberries, orange juice, and nuts, and blend well.

Pour into a greased 9x5-inch loaf pan and bake in a preheated 350 degree oven until a toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean, about 50 minutes.
